

## ***NCAA Division 1 and 2 - Minimum Test Scores for 2016 Graduates***

**In Division I**, there is a sliding scale of test score (SAT and/or ACT) and GPA. Students graduating in 2016 will need to meet these requirements, along with meeting the new core course requirements. The GPA that is used on the scale is only that of core-courses, no electives. (See NCAA Initial Eligibility Requirements.)

**NEW (DI only):** Ten of the 16 core courses must be completed before the 7th semester of high school. Of these 10 classes, 7 must be in English, Math, or Science.

**In Division II**, there is a minimum test-score requirement of 820 on the SAT (critical reading and math only), or 68 sum score on ACT. There is a 16 core-course requirement that is slightly different from Division I.

**In Division III**, students do not have to be cleared by the NCAA Eligibility Center.

### ***Official Test Scores***

- Must be reported directly to the NCAA Eligibility Center from the ACT or SAT.
- Scores will not be taken off transcripts or from a student score report.
- When registering for the ACT or SAT- Students should enter the Eligibility Center code of **9999** so it goes directly to the Eligibility Center at no extra charge. (Students get 4 free reports upon registering and until 9 days after the test. These can be sent to schools too.) Each extra report cost \$11.25.
- Students taking the SAT or ACT multiple times, must send scores each time to the Eligibility Center.
